The IICL has created five new chassis technical bulletins to address various issues dealing with the inspection and maintenance of intermodal chassis. These bulletins help clarify various inspection items relating to our chassis guide and more specifically components such as landing legs, structural components, brake chamber pus rods and mud flaps. Several of the bulletins are supported with photos and drawings to help the reader better understand the items and issues in question. In addition we have also created a technical safety paper which addresses spring brake disarmament.

The IICL and its chassis members will issue future additional technical bulletins and information papers in concert with its manuals, to the assist in effective inspection, repair and maintenance of chassis.
